# Ministers Letter

Dear Friends,

"Remembering". It seems to be hardwired into November, doesn't it? We start with All Saints, when we remember *all* God's holy people, then there's the famous 5<sup>th.</sup> On Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday, we remember those who gave their lives for a better world, and recall the violence humanity is capable of.

Memories are important. Toxic memories from childhood can blight an adult's life, while good memories of past blessings, and our traditions of worship, can sustain us through tough, dark times-like 2020!

But one unsettling aspect of this year has been how we *haven't* been able to follow some of our usual traditions, say at Harvest and Easter. In exile in Old Testament times, God's people cried out, "How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?" In my ministry, and in my own family, I have also met people who live with dementia, whose memories are no longer what they were, and who express themselves very differently from how they used to. It's distressing both for the people living with the condition, and for those who love them.

And yet...God spoke to the people in exile, the words, "Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you. I have called you by name: you are mine". I believe He says these words to us today too. He that in the pain and muddle of this year. we are still His people. Whether or not we are able to respond logically and verbally to His love, I believe it is still there. God has redeemed us, we are His.

# **HOMELESS SERVICE – Sunday 29th November 2020**

This is normally a United Service but this year, because of the current restrictions, each Fellowship will hold their individual services but still intend to donate goods (and money).

There are two organisations in Loughborough which we support in alternate years. Last year it was the Falcon Centre so this year it is The Bridge.

The Bridge charity in Loughborough would very much welcome items for their Starter Packs.

These packs are given to clients who have just been given/found accommodation, but have no income or possessions to make it their home.

Each pack includes:

Double duvet, cover and fitted sheet.

2 x pillows.

Toaster.

Kettle.

Cutlery – knives, forks, spoons, teaspoons x 2 each pack.

Crockery – bowls, plates, mugs, side plates x 2 of each per pack.

These packs are in high demand at the moment, and they don't have the budget to ensure that we can give them to everybody. We realise that some of these items are more expensive than others, and so it is ok if we get more of one thing than another; everything will help!"
